A native Texan, Trevia began her genealogical research with a ninth-grade English project. She maintains active membership in a number of archival, cemetery, historical, genealogical, library, lineage, and preservation organizations for years, and has served as a member of the Angelina College genealogy faculty 1998 - 2014, first as assistant and then coordinator.

Trevia has lectured and conducted seminars and workshops throughout Texas, and Louisiana, and teaches genealogy classes in Houston. Listed in several biographical publications, including *Who's Who in Genealogy & Heraldry*, Trevia is a past president of the Texas State Genealogical Society (1984-1987), co-founded the Houston Genealogical Institute (1979-1981) and served as host chairman for Clayton Library Friends for the 1994 National Genealogical Society Conference held in Houston. A free-lance writer, she has been published in *The French Genealogist*, the *CLF Newsletter*, the Houston Genealogical Forum's quarterly and other periodicals such as the *Barbers Hill Life* magazine. Mrs. Beverly compiled a series of Texas county cemetery directories, and authored *Suffer the Children: A History of the Confederate Orphanage at Bayland, Texas*. She has served on the Harris County Historical Commission since 1995 and is a Life Member of the Baytown Genealogy Society and the Baytown Historical Preservation Association.
